Autumn 2	What have the Romans ever done for us?	History Links to D & T	<b>Design and make a true-to-life scaled model</b> of an ancient Roman town.	<b>Pupils will be historians, Town Planners and architects.</b> They will design a Roman town and make a small-scale model to exhibit around the school.
Spring 1	The Globetrotter Cafe	Geography Links to D&T / business/ ICT/ maths	<b>Find out about Globetrotter cafes</b> around the world and <b>open your own café(s)</b> .	<b>Pupils will be Geographers and entrepreneurs.</b> They will research the Globetrotter Cafes around the world and create their own Globetrotter café.
Spring 2	Follow Me!	R.E. Links to Computing/ literacy/ speaking & listening	<b>Produce a tourist guide for visitors to Durham Cathedral</b> to reflect the religious beliefs of Christians and the significance of the Northern Saints.	<b>Pupils will be Tour Guides</b> for Durham Cathedral. They need to find out about the main features of this place of worship and about the Northern Saints for whom it was built.
Summer 1	'Everything you can imagine is real...'	Art & Design	<b>Compare the artwork</b> of the artists Pablo Picasso and Georges Flogel. Produce your own 'works of art' for display in the Thornley Art Gallery.	<b>Pupils will be artists, art-historians, biographers and art-critics.</b> They will look at the famous paintings of Picasso and Flogel. They will find out about the two artists and produce their own art work in the style of the artists to put in a gallery.
Summer 2	What's in the News?	The Arts Link to Media/ computing/ current affairs	<b>Publish or broadcast news reports</b> for a school newspaper and/or TV programme.	<b>Pupils will be journalists, researchers, presenters and editors.</b> They will produce multi-media news reports to share with the rest of the school
